They were on vacation and others filled in for them, and Pam noted it is a huge job that they do each week. Jaci Shields also noted that the packing process is really organized and takes no more than 45 minutes.

Luminaries. Terri Mast, Chair of the Luminary Committee, spoke about the work being done for this fundraiser. She passed sign-up sheets around for volunteers for kit assembly dates, which will be held three different days at Jane Corby's house. Terri said more block captains were needed, and she will send a note out about which streets still need to be covered.

Meeting Ads. Nancy Mills gave a \$1 meeting ad for the hydro fitness class at the pool every day beginning at 9:00 a.m. Nancy said it is an excellent class and encouraged all of us to attend.
