BOARD HIGHLIGHTS - October 2023

- Treasurer Linda Werring reports that as of October 4, the Club has 188 paid members. Holiday Arts & Crafts Fair Vendors and buyers of Luminaria kits requesting refunds will receive a check for the total amount, including those that paid online.
- Donna Habing shared the survey results from the September general meeting of suggested organizations to support. She is currently working on a calendar of monthly charitable projects and services.
- Activities Director Cindy Triay is making reservations for the Dolphin and History Cruise scheduled for Wednesday, October 18. Eighteen people have signed up so far. Three eblasts have been sent out with all the information and how to pay for your reservation.
- The items collected for the AMI Kids personal hygiene drive were delivered. Suzanne Foster and Donna Habing reported that they were very impressed by the AMI Kids facilities and students.
