Spring Boutique Cancelled


The Board decided to not hold a Spring Boutique due to the pandemic. Hopefully, we can do this again next November.


We Keep Giving



Mar 10 - General Meeting @ 3:30


The women's club will meet this month and in case you have forgotten, it's Wednesday, March 10th at 3:30 in the Crystal Dining Room at the Club.


We Keep Giving


Kathie Cardon fulfilled a request from the Bannerman Learning Center for uniforms that students are required to wear. Our donation was \$300.00.



What's Happening


- ► The Scholarship Committee has received 14 applications. Joanne reported that the "need" for a scholarship had the highest priority on the rating scale of the applicants.



Our scholarship is named in memory of a founding member, Gisela Ferrell, who hoped we could one day help girls get a higher education. Our first scholarships were awarded in May 2003. After she passed from breast cancer later that year, the scholarship was named in her honor.

This will be a "don't miss" program. The City is making long range plans for the future with so much development coming soon. Some of our members are part of the new






food in both Clay and Duval Counties. They have donated many products to our Maggies Meals program.




- ► The Board reversed its decision and voted to open all board meetings to members to observe. If a member would like to present an item, she must contact the President prior to the meeting.


