MINUTES OF THE MEETING

February 12, 2003

Kathie opened the meeting. Barbara read the minutes and a motion was made by Thresa Oliverio to accept the minutes as read that was seconded by Racquel Dutton. Kathie gave the treasurer's report stating that we had an opening balance of \$5,587.90 and a closing balance of \$5,864.16. There is an additional \$2,163.13 in the Bennett Fund. This is their 50th anniversary.

Susan spoke about sponsoring one of the summer programs at the Green Cove Springs library. Sharene Jones would like to come and speak to us about the programs that are still available. Susan will find out if we can take used books there or to another location.

Susan then made a motion that the MPWC sponsor a \$1,000 scholarship for a female student at Clay High School. The recipient would be chosen by a scholarship committee. Donna Medara seconded the motion. Susan talked about what the scholarship should be based on with the monies being paid directly to the school. Joyce Berry said the Green Cove Springs Women's Club worked through guidance at the high school. A lengthy discussion ensued regarding rules and guidelines. The motion passed unanimously.

Kathie said that we are already committed to giving the Clay County Coalition \$200 annually. A motion was made by Alice Kerrigan and seconded by Geri Isgan that we give \$500 to the food pantry.

The Nominating Committee will meet and present a slate of officers for next month's meeting.

Kathie told us about donating old cell phones to places like the Quigley House. The phones, even without service, will always register 911 calls.

Thresa mentioned that Tuesday, March 4 is the date to vote on the sales tax increase.

Minutes of the Meeting

September 10, 2003
