Rule of the Month: By Cissy Lorch Rule 8. Advice; Indicating Line of Play

Rule 8-1. During a stipulated round, a player must not:

- (a) give advice to anyone in the competition playing on the course other than his (her) partner;
- (b) ask for advice from anyone other than his(her) partner or either of their caddies.

Examples: Golfers love to share: "How far am I?"; "It looks like a 6-iron, but I'd hit a 5-iron with this wind."; "Does this putt break right over the ridge?"

Offering or asking for any advice that could affect the way a player executes a shot is against the rules unless it comes from a caddie or partner. The USGA has ruled that sharing knowledge information is acceptable.

Example: Asking if the flagstick is in the front or back of the green. This is okay since the pin's location is public knowledge.

New Food Minimum In Effect

Super Bowl week is finally here! To kick off Super Sunday, we are hosting a "Super Bowl" Golf Tournament. The shotgun will begin at 9:30 am and conclude in the grill room with our special Super Bowl Sunday Brunch. You can make your own team - ladies, men and guests are welcome to play in

this event. The fee is \$25.00 for members and \$60.00 for guests. – guests will pay the event fee plus green/cart fees. Sign up in the Pro Shop.

A few months ago, the committee changed the hazards on the bulkheads. When the stakes or lines are on the inside part of the bulkhead and your ball is resting on the wood, it is considered to be in the hazard. Since there are areas where the ground is lower than the bulkhead, this situation can happen frequently. For example, on Red #3, if your ball is resting on the bulkhead and you have no shot, you would have to use the drop area. Now that the stakes are on the outside part of the bulkhead, you get relief and can take a drop without penalty if the bulkhead interferes with your stroke or stance. This is a common way to mark bulkheads. If you have any questions, please see me.

It is not to late to start the New Year with better golf! Don and I are offering lesson packages to lower your handicap. One lesson, three lessons, five lessons and yearly packages available to help achieve your goals of lower scores and more enjoyment. Assistant Pro Mark Collins will be offering junior clinics starting on Saturday, February 12. The clinics will be from 10 am to 11 am at a cost of \$10 (minimum of 3 students). Ages range from 6-15 and yes, friends are welcome.

Recently, I gave a lesson to Gary Dake and we talked about sport psychology and the mental aspects of the game. He was reading an article by Dr. Bob Rotella that I want to share with you.

Ten Things a Player Must Do in Every Competitive Round:

- 1. Play to play great -- Don't play not to play poorly
- 2. Love the challenge of the day whatever it may be
- 3. Get out of results and get more into process
- 4. Know that nothing will bother or upset you on the golf course, and you will be in great state of mind every shot
- 5. Playing with a feeling that the outcome doesn't matter is always preferable to caring too much
- 6. Believe in yourself so you can play freely
- 7. See where you want the ball to go before every shot
- 8. Be decisive committed and clear
- 9. Be your own best friend
- 10. Love your wedge and your putter

From Tee to Green

A few words this month on "Frost Delays" and "Divots on the Greens"--

The reason for FROST DELAYS is simple – traffic on turf covered in frost will damage the leaves of the turfgrass plant. Traffic comes from foot traffic and CART traffic.

If you step on a green when it is covered in frost, the pressure of your foot causes the ice crystals to crush into the leaves of the turfgrass severely damaging the turf. (PUTTING GREEN INCLUDED.) Waiting for the course to open includes the practice areas, putting green and the range.

Frost delays will back up tee times for the entire day. The severity of the delay is determined by how quickly the temperature climbs high enough to burn off the frost. So if you have a later tee time, call the Pro Shop to inquire about the delay time. Also, the first three greens on each nine and the putting green, are usually the last ones to burn off due to the fact that these greens are covered in shade in the morning.

Most mornings, I have a pretty good idea how long it will take for the frost to burn off, and I inform the Pro Shop approximately how long the delay will be. Sometimes, I can speed up the process by lightly watering to aid in washing the frost off the leaf blades, as long as it is warm enough to water. So, again call the Pro Shop for a report.

When it's cold or after a rainy night, please use cart paths and streets to come to the Pro Shop. Riding down the non-cart path rough areas or across fairways causes frost damage or tracks from wet conditions.

BALL MARKS: We are having more play and obviously more ball marks. Please carry a divot repair tool! Joe, Travis and I have been watching this situation for some time. The ball marks are usually the smaller ones that are created when a shot hits the green and advances quite a bit or rolls off the green.

Or, they are right next to the collar, where the ball hit the green. The large ball marks that are near someone's shot are usually repaired and it's the smaller ones that go unattended. This is not a member issue or an outside play issue, everyone is missing a few of those each round. We have watched golfers actually look around the area after one of those shots and they couldn't find the actual mark they made. However, sometimes they fixed one because we were watching and we knew where their ball landed, and it wasn't the right one.

THEREFORE: We have all done it – look around and repair what is near you while waiting for play to continue. It's OK to repair more than one, we have all missed a divot we made. We have new reminder signs on the outside play carts and Travis has instructed the cart staff to put them on the member carts for awhile as a simple reminder.

2005 will be a lot busier than 2004, we are growing and need everyone to help in this area. Coming back to the clubhouse to tell us about ball marks is too late!

If your ball mark happens to take a minute piece of turf out of the green, DO NOT TRY TO PUT IT IN THE SAME HOLE, it will not grow back. Repair the mark without it.

Thank you for your help in these important topics and most of all thanks for the compliments that have been passed on regarding the good condition of the course. "PLAYING IT DOWN" all year round is quite a compliment to my staff.

Consideration For Others: Players should always show consideration for other players on the course and should not disturb their play by moving, talking, or making unnecessary noise.

From Tee to Green

On March 6th and 7th the greens will be aerified with 3/8th inch diameter solid aerification tines. These tines will make a hole in the green the diameter of a pencil and are spaced on two inch centers. This aerification is necessary to aid in relieving compaction, also releasing carbon dioxides out of the soil and adding air into the soil strata. Recovery time is usually less than a week. Unlike the major aerification we will be performing in May and August, no plugs will be pulled and no top-dressing is necessary.

The greens will be double cut and rolled for the MEMBER-MEMBER and most likely you will not even notice a difference with this aerification process.

A follow up on the topic of "ball marks" thank you, the marks have disappeared considerably.

Do not forget to add the convenience of less travel time, no traffic hassles, less gas and oil, etc. A big plus is that at the club you are in a familiar atmosphere with friends and staff that you know! Most every club is different in its operation. Initiation fees vary, dues are different, some have private carts, some don't, free range balls, range fees – it is amazing how many examples of different clubs are mentioned to me and the staff. From Tee to Green

We recently purchased a TURF SLICING machine to aid in compaction and to improve water infiltration through the soil strata – i.e. loosen up hard fairways like White # 7 and help drainage on Blue #1, Red #4, etc.

The machine is called a GROUNDBREAKER and connects to an existing tractor and will SLICE through the turf from 3 to 10 inches deep on 6" centers and can do approximately one acre per hour. Right now, we are going down 8" on the tees and fairways. We average two holes a day, so it will take a little more than a month for the first pass. This will be an ongoing process and does little to no inconvenience to play since no plugs or turf are removed. This will greatly improve the overall playability of the course by relieving compaction. Air and water will penetrate through the soil more readily and allow the turfgrass to grow stronger. Standing water in the fairway will be reduced because the water will drain downward and easier.

Over time, the course will drain better, but have a little less roll by softening up the fairways and improving the turf base.

I am excited about the technique as it will take the course to another level of quality turf.

Rule of the Month Definition: Out of Bounds

By Cissy Lorch

"Out of Bounds" is beyond the boundaries of the course or any part of the course so marked by the committee.

When out of bounds is defined by reference to stakes or a fence or as being beyond stakes or a fence, the out of bounds line is determined by the nearest inside points of the stakes or fence posts at ground level.

Objects defining out of bounds such as walls, fences, stakes and railings are not obstructions and are deemed to be fixed. When out of bounds is defined by a line on the ground, the line itself is out of bounds. A ball is out of bounds when all of it lies out of bounds. A player may stand out of bounds to play a ball lying within bounds.

On the Blue #7, the cinder blocks on the left side behind the out of bounds marker are not on golf course property. So, if the ball remains in bounds, but the cinder blocks are in your swing path, you have to take an unplayable lie as defined in Rule 28.

From Tee to Green

By: Dana Anderson, Golf Course Superintendent

May is what I call the "transition month" because the overseeded Poa Trivilis starts to die out on the greens and the Tifdwarf bermuda grass begins to grow. The main factor is the air and soil temperatures. The rule of thumb is that bermuda grass doesn't start actively growing until the soil temperature consistently stays above 60 degrees at the night. Usually that means the air temperature during the day is above 80 degrees. The opposite is true of Poa Trivilas – it begins to checkout when the daytime temps stay in the 80's during the day.

So what we have is the cool season grass is dying out and the warm season grass is starting to actively grow. During this transition time, the greens are going to be: (1) slower due to the fact the height of the cut is raised, (2) bumpier until the bermuda grass fills in and (3) aerified on May 22 and 23. This aerification is a major one using 3/4 inch hollow tines and heavily top dressed behind. It is a necessary evil that no one likes, but has to be done. Hopefully, two weeks after the aerification, the greens will be transitioned back to bermuda grass until the fall of the year.

Rule of the Month: Rule Changes

By: Cissy Lorch

These rules will govern the game until January 1, 2008. During a year period, the USGA and the Royal and Ancient will review the new code and other issues that arise for possible inclusion in the rules book to be released January 1, 2008.

- 1. A tee must be no longer than 4 inches
- 2. Loose impediments on a player's line of putt can be removed by any means. (Rule 16-1c)
- 3. Players are required to place a ball in all situations when resuming play after suspension. (Rule 6-8d)
- 4. Tournament committees now have the authority to disqualify players for breaches of etiquette.
- 5. A 48 inch length limit on all clubs except a putter.
- 6. A maximum club head size of 460cc, plus an additional manufacturing tolerance of 10cc, has been adopted.
- 7. Amateur golfers will be able to accept up to \$750.00 in merchandise prizes, raised from \$500.00.
- 8. The fundamental principles by which the game is played play the course as you find it and the ball as it lies are unchanged from the first known rules in 1744.

The winter season has ended and it has been quite an active one. The real estate at Magnolia Point is on fire and new families are moving in every week. Several courses in the Jacksonville area have lost all of their greens prior to their annual aerification. An unusually dry, cool spring and has tested many courses. The "transition period" at most of the area courses has been a challenge this year and we have survived very well, thanks to Dana and his entire crew.

If you play 13 holes and you get rained out, you must post an 18 hole score (holes 14-18 post your score based on your course handicap). If you are rained out during holes 7-12, you must post a nine hole score. If you play nine holes, you must post a nine hole score. If you have any questions, please see me.

The greens aerification on May 22 - 24 was very successful because of the sunny weather conditions during the entire operation.

After an aerification, the recovery time is usually 10 to 14 days because it takes that long for the turfgrass to grow through the sand top-dressing and the greens mowers are no longer picking up sand. My mechanic, Jimmy Carr, will be very happy when that occurs! Sand reeks havoc on reels and bed knives.

The greens "height of cut" is raised during this grow-in period to promote more root and shoot growth. The proper fertilizers and other soil amendments have been applied according to the latest soil test recommendations. Therefore, the greens will be bumpy and slower for a little while. A few rain showers would help immensely as irrigation water is no match for what Mother Nature provides.

Also, we are going to start a weed eradication program on the greens. We have two persistent types of weeds – nutsedge and Virginia buttonweed. The latter is the more difficult one to eradicate. It's the weed that is prevalent on the back of White #3 and White #5. Once we spray, you will see results when the weeds start turning brown and then, straw colored. It's not going to be a pretty sight once you see how much nutgrass is on some of the greens, especially Red #4 and Blue #4.

Please, bear with me as it is going to take most of the summer to accomplish this task.

From Tee to Green

As of June 24, the greens on the White and Blue Nines are pretty much finished with their transition from the overseed Poa Trivialis to Bermudagrass.

We are still combating the Virginia Buttonweed on a spot spray basis and hopefully, once it is eradicated the Bermuda will fill in. We also have sprayed a plant growth regulator (PGR) on the greens to slow down the upright growth habit of the Bermuda, which will in turn make the greens faster without sacrificing turf quality. Actually, the PGR promotes lateral growth and enhances more root growth.

The next group of weeds we will be killing on the greens are the Sedges and Goosegrass. When we spray for the Sedges, a few of the greens will have quite a bit of discoloration due to the fact that there is a lot of Sedge in them. Again, once they are killed, the Bermuda should fill in.

The Red Nine greens, especially #5 - #8, are a little behind in transition because the Poa Trivialis hung in there longer and has impeded the Bermuda from growing in. The herbicide we use (Revolver) for controlling Goosegrass will also take out Poa Trivialis. That herbicide has already been applied and it usually takes about 10 days for it to do its thing so bear with us – by midmonth the greens should be well on their way to recovery.

Again, thanks for being patient while all of the chemicals are taking effect.

Handicaps (this bears repeating):

Recently, I have had quite a few questions concerning individual handicaps. A player should shoot their handicap 25% of the time. There never should be a time when a player misses a putt or hits a faulty shot on

purpose. All players are required to post every round into the handicap system. If you play 13 holes and you get rained out, you must post an 18 hole score (holes 14-18 post your score based on your course handicap). If you are rained out during holes 7-12, you must post a nine hole score. If you play nine holes, you must post a nine hole score. If you have any questions, please see me.

From Tee to Green

On August 21st and 22nd, the greens will be aerated and top-dressed. This will be the final aeration of the year on the greens. Recovery time should be much quicker than last May's aeration because the greens are much healthier which means they should grow over the aeration holes in seven to ten days. By Labor Day weekend, the greens will be in good shape and better than they were before aeration. This is a necessary evil that no one likes, but it has to be done to ensure we continue to have healthy greens.

Also, we have been widening some of the fairways that have gotten smaller over time due to mowing inconsistencies. In other words, when a fairway mower operator does the perimeter cut to outline the fairway sometimes they will miss the edge on the fairway/rough cut and cheat in an inch or two so as to not scalp into the rough cut. Over time that inch or two turns into feet and then yards. Bear in mind that when operating a sevengang fairway unit, it is very difficult to be precise to the inch when you are sitting on a tractor and the outside reel is six feet behind you. As you may have noticed, when we widen the fairways they will be scalped and straw-colored until they adapt to the lower height.

Attention all Golfers!

If you are not sure what to do Labor Day Weekend, plan on playing in one of our 2 events scheduled on Sunday, September 4. Both are 9am shotguns, one net event and one gross event. The net event is a \$25 entry, which includes payout and a great luncheon following play. The format is 2 net better balls of 4 (90% of handicap).

The second event is 1 gross better ball of 2. The entry fee is \$40, which includes payout for 1^{st} and 2^{nd} place and gross skins

(skins are a cash payout). Each 2-man team must have a combined team handicap of 12 or higher (course handicap).

For both events, the teams can be made up with men, ladies, couples or guests with handicaps. If you invite a guest, the fee for the guest is the entry fee plus a cart fee.

I hope everyone is enjoying the new Pro Shop as much as we are. We are continuing to receive new merchandise all the time. If you see a club or an item we do not have in the shop, check to see if we can special order it. Most of the time, we beat Edwin Watts or other local vendors pricing for our members.

Read the following to help lower your scores with the flatstick:

- ► Did you know that 43% of your game is putting?
- Do you know that the club practiced with the most is the driver?
- ▶ Do you know the easiest way to lower your handicap is?

The answer is the flat stick! Most golfers hit 4 greens in regulation. That means you have to chip at least 14 times. If you make the putt, chances are you will make par. Now how do we become better putters? Well the answer is simple.... Practice and develop a solid pre-shot routine. If you hit a tee shot 300 yards in the middle of the fairway and then miss a 3-foot putt, you did not reward yourself for that great tee.

When putting, a few common mistakes are inconsistent strokes, body movement, and no pre-shot routine. My suggestions are the following:

- 1. Put two 2X4's parallel on the ground separated the width of your putter. Make practice strokes with the club going straight back, straight through, with the putter staying between the 2X4's. This will help you make a consistent stroke that will keep the putter square through impact.
- 2. The only body parts that move are your shoulders. Your shoulders control your arms in the putting stroke. There should be no lower body movement! As you make your stroke, watch the ball disappear and listen to the sound of the ball hitting the bottom of the cup.

Before you hit the ball, you should have prepared yourself with a pre-shot routine. Look at both sides of the green to determine which way the ball will break. Take some practice strokes to feel how hard or soft you need to hit the ball. Pick out a spot in front of your ball to line the putter with, and make that perfect stroke. Before making the stroke, visualize the ball rolling in the hole.

From Tee to Green

The week of October 17 - 21, we will be overseeding the greens, tees and collars. The greens on the white and blue nines will be done on the 17th (weather permitting). Therefore, the white and blue nines will be closed on the that day and the Red Nine will be open. Preparation for overseeding will begin with verticutting the greens fairly aggressively in two directions and then applying ten lbs. of poa trivialis per thousand sq. ft. Then, a light topdressing will be applied and drug in. Next, we will apply a starter fertilizer and water lightly two to three times a day, similar to a syringe cycle to keep the seed wet. Germination will occur between seven and 14 days. The height of cut will remain the same throughout the overseeding period.

Tees and collars will be seeded with perennial ryegrass using a similar process as the greens except no topdressing will be applied. The seeding rate for the tees and collars is twenty lbs. per thousand sq. ft. Again, germination will occur between 7 and 17 days. Red #3 will be overseeded "wall to wall", meaning the entire hole, including the rough area to Colonial Drive. This is an experiment just to see how it looks!

On a different subject, I have had my employees tell me on various occasions while mowing, a few of the members and guests are giving them the "slash the throat" sign meaning "cut the engine off" while they are playing. Players are also giving them disgusting, shaking their heads looks. I am a golfer too and yes, it can be annoying to hear a tractor or mower or sand trap rake while you are attempting to play a shot. I have instructed my staff to be courteous and be aware of golfers. We do most of our

mowing in a backwards direction so as to only disturb the same group once. But, sometimes we are in the way. For instance, say you come up to a tee and see a fairway mower coming down the fairway at you, you are ready to tee off, the mower keeps coming (they are possibly looking at the cut line), wait until the mower turns around and heads back up the fairway until it is out of range. This usually takes only a minute. Once the mower is out of the range, common sense should kick in for the operator and keep out of your range until all the players have hit. Simply put, on occasion, we will be in the way. We attempt to keep that to a minimum, but at the same time, try to work in harmony with you. In the future, if you want an operator to stop, put your hand up like a traffic cop and they should stop for you and please, smile rather than frown at them! Now when there's a tournament going on, you should not see any maintenance being done or hear any equipment being run.

The majority of the players understand this situation, however I am appealing to the minority to understand we have hundreds of acres to maintain in a timely fashion.

Due to "Wilma", the overseeding of the white and blue greens was delayed three days. It was completed on October 27, about a week later than scheduled – still, within the window for overseeding in this region.

Now that it is finally cooling down, we can concentrate more on golf course improvements rather than mowing all the time. Some of these projects will include drainage problems in the bunkers and additional sand in the ones that need it; cart path edging, drainage and resurfacing of broken and missing sections. Also, repair to the entrance and exit paths (they have become quite bumpy in some areas). Remove dead trees and prune lower limbs of the live ones. More drainage problems are to be addressed, such as Red #9 green, Blue #1, #2, and #3 greens where the water puddles after it rains, and a complete cleaning out of all existing drains and catch basins that have been slow to drain as of late. Flower beds will be pruned, weeded and mulched. Faded tee signs will be painted as well as the hole design on each.

Again, these are just some of the projects to be done over the winter months.
