

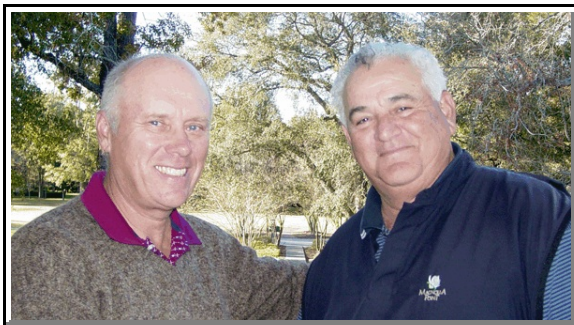

HAPPY NEW YEAR! Another year has flown by and 2006 is off and running!

ADDITIONAL MEMBER BENEFITS:

- ▶ Effective January 3, all food and beverage charges will have a 10% member discount automatically deducted.
- ▶ A discount on annual dues if paid by January 15, as opposed to monthly dues.
- ▶ A discount on full trail fees if paid by January 15, as opposed to monthly fees.

These discounts are significantly more than the \$100.00 fee to belong to the annual Merchandise Plan.

MERCHANDISE PLAN:

Typically, all merchandise and golf products in Pro Shops are priced at double the cost. On our tags, both the Retail and Member Plan prices are marked. Our "Member Plan" price is our cost plus 15% and that makes "every day a sale day" in the Pro Shop! The \$100 annual fee for the Member Plan puts all purchases at a lower price than the discount golf stores and also saves you gas and traffic hassles!

Over 100 members have already joined and it's a "win/win" for everyone. Stop by the Pro Shop and check it out yourself. You do not have to be a golf member to take advantage of this program – all members (tennis, pool, clubhouse) can join. 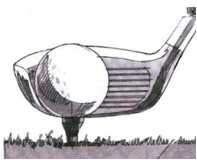
Men's Senior Interclub Golf

“Know your Handicap”

The MGA Handicap Committee is “now is session.” Every month, we will try to address an issue of importance to all members. This month will include some decisions the USGA has made for the year 2006.

Decision 1-2/2: “All golf clubs must be licensed by the USGA to utilize the USGA handicap system”

Magnolia point is licensed by the USGA and will enforce the handicap system.

One of the most abused rules is that of “equitable stroke control“(esc). Equitable stroke control is the downward adjustment of individual hole scores for handicap purposes in order to make handicaps more representative of a player's potential ability. “Esc” sets a maximum number of strokes that a player can post on any hole depending on the player's course handicap (not your handicap index). There is no limit to the number of holes on which a player may adjust his or her score. Please adjust your score before entering it into the computer.

Adjustments using “equitable stroke control” are as follows:

<u>Your</u> <u>Course Handicap</u>	<u>Max. # of Strokes</u> <u>You Post On Any Hole</u>
9 or less	Double bogey
10 through 19	7
20 through 29	8
30 through 39	9
40 or more	10

Example of adjustment to hole score: A player with a course handicap of 13 has a maximum number of 7 for any hole regardless of par. A player with a course handicap of 42 has a maximum number of 10 for any hole.

Please check for your maximum hole score based on your handicap and always adjust your score.

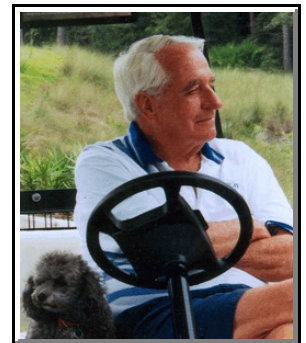

Prime Rib and Crab legs are coming back in February.

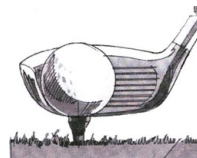

“Handicapping the Course”

The allocation of handicap strokes for each hole is based on the play of the course from the tee-markers used most often by the majority of club members.

In the next few weeks, we will be working on handicapping the holes on all three courses. A mathematical method for allocating strokes, based on the principle that a handicap stroke should be an equalizer when an average or high-handicapped player plays a low handicapped player follows. We will be asking several men and women with certain handicaps to turn in scores for posting on a hole to hole form.

The committee will then determine the difficulty relative to par between the low and high handicap players. The committee will give consideration to all holes containing different hazards. The results will only be as good as the information we receive from you, the players. If you are asked to keep score for this purpose, do not use equitable stroke control when posting your score on the score card.

In the next few weeks, we will require 200 scores from high and low handicappers. If you have any questions please contact me at anytime.

From Tee to Green

We are in the process of troubleshooting the drainage problems in the bunkers, especially on the Red Nine. After a heavy rain, the bunkers on holes 4 - 8 fill with water and do not drain or are very slow to drain out. These bunkers are the most recently built on the entire 27

holes (in 2003) and we have an as-built drainage blueprint of the drains on holes 5-8. As a matter of fact, these are the only holes on the entire 27 that we have an “as-built” drainage plan! One would think that being the newest bunkers on the course, and having an exact blueprint that there shouldn't be a drainage problem. What we have found out is that during construction of the bunkers and after all the drains were installed, the bunker sand was not put in before heavy rains eroded the clay soil and formed a seal over the drains preventing the water to percolate through the sand and into the drain. This muck was not removed before the bunker sand was added.

To correct the problem, we are digging all the muck out on top of the drains and adding additional gravel on top of the drain tile, then putting fresh bunker sand on top of the gravel. Fortunately, none of the muck has gotten into the drain itself or this would be a major project in that we would have to replace all the drain tile.

Also in the works, we will be relocating the rain shelter on #5 White and putting it at the bag drop in front of the Pro Shop. We are continuing our post emerge control the of the winter weeds. A complete re-emerge application for summer weeds on a fertilizer carrier will be applied on the entire three nines at the end of February. Spring will be here before you know it!

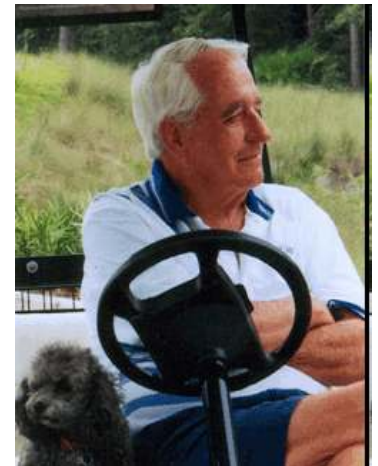

From Joe's Desk

Dana and the Golf Course Maintenance team have been quite busy this winter. Tree and brush cutting are ongoing, and new drains have been installed in many new areas. The entire golf course was fertilized, the last week of February, and the initial segment of weed control has been distributed, at the same time. The greens have been treated with a chemical to reduce the salt content in the turf. Salt

is what attracts the insects and insects attract the moles that feed on the insects. If we eliminate the food chain, many of the ongoing problems will diminish. The salt content comes from the reclaimed water that we use daily in our irrigation system. The greens have also been treated with a deep tine injection of air. Turf requires, food, water and oxygen.....this process injected air, and fractured the turf 10 inches below ground. This allows the roots to grow deeper by fracturing the thatch that has built up over the years, and also improved the ability for quicker drainage from heavy rains. All 27 holes and the practice green received this process at the beginning of February.

New fairway drains were installed at the end of RED # 4 fairway. This will be an ongoing replacement process. All of the fairway drains are "surface water drains", when the fairways are saturated the ground water, "water under the surface level of a drain", cannot escape in a timely fashion. The new drains allow ground water to penetrate the sides of the drain "underground" and be released through the drain system of the surface water drains. "WET FAIRWAYS AND ROUGHS are LOVED BY WEEDS - this drainage project is another step to eliminate weeds. Last year was a very wet, and a very difficult year of weed control; we are working on multiple solutions, including various spray treatments, because one type does not destroy all types of weed.

Construction is moving along nicely downstairs and the 28th Hole will definitely be another option that will offer choices to all members. Many ask when it will be completed and the answer is still the same...sometime in 2006.

From Tee to Green

The entire 27 holes, the driving range, the clubhouse, and all the common areas were fertilized with a pre-emerge herbicide on a fertilizer carrier (commonly known as a weed and feed) at the end of February. Now that we're into March, warmer temperatures are on the way - which means the bermudagrass will start greening back up and growing.

Projects that we are working on in March include moving the rain shelter behind #5 white and relocating it to the bag drop area. Installing a catch basin off the collar on #9 red green and also one in the back of #2 blue green so as to eliminate the standing water on the greens after a heavy rain. We'll also be slicing the tees and fairways again with

the groundbreaker to aid in relieving compaction and help drainage. We are continuing the constant battle of eradicating various weeds by post emerge spraying - mostly poa annua and volunteer ryegrass.

This and that - Just a reminder that carts are restricted to the CART PATH ONLY on all the par 3 holes always, unless you have a handicap flag. Please refrain from hitting lob shots to the chipping green - there are a million ball marks on it. We are going to take the ropes up around the putting green. Please, please keep carts off the newly sodded St. Augustine grass and also don't drive over it to get around other parked carts next to the putting green. THANK YOU!

From Tee to Green

For the past two months, we have been on a new spray program on the greens. The **PROBLEM** is that salt, I should say nitrates, get into the soil through the irrigation system (reclaimed water) along with heavy metals such as copper, nickel, zinc, and cadmium. The use of synthetic fertilizers which contain nitrates also contributes to this problem.

The **SOLUTION**, without getting too technical, is that we are spraying a variety of plant "energizers," enzymes, bacteria, calcium, and other nutrients to aid in restoring carbohydrates to the plant by way of unlocking the salts that are bound to the soil molecule and replacing them with what the plant needs to generate new root and shoot growth.

In the next seven to ten days certain weeds on the greens will discolor and die. The first victim will be the Virginia buttonweed. This is the prime time to eradicate the buttonweed and its cousins.

The next victim will be the sedges on the greens. This cannot be sprayed now because doing so would kill the overseeded grass. Right before we do the next major aerifying in late May, we will treat the sedges. By then the bermudagrasses will have recovered and it will not be bothered by the sedge treatment.

We are gaining ground! Thank you for all the positive comments regarding the condition of the golf course.

From Tee to Green

Wow, it’s May already and time to do a major greens aerification! We are scheduled to begin on Sunday afternoon, May 21st on the Red 9. The entire course plus the driving range will be closed on Monday, May 22. We will use 1" aerifying tines and top dressing heavily. The recovery time is usually 10 days to two weeks.

This aerification signals the transition from the overseeded grass, poa trivialis, back to bermudagrass. As the poa trivialis dies out due to the heat, the bermudagrass will fill in. This takes time and is also weather related. For instance, if we are still in a drought mode, it will take longer than two weeks. If not and we get normal rainfall, the recovery time will be shorter. I will be fertilizing every week to promote new growth of the bermudagrass and raising the mowing height slightly to further encourage the grass to mature and fill in. So bare with us, I don’t like doing this procedure any more than you do, but it is a necessary evil that has to be done.

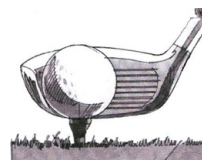
More new residents are moving in each month and Magnolia Point is growing, changing and moving forward.

Golf Cart Drivers Must Be Licenced

With school out and grandkids visiting, everyone should know that under Florida laws, **anyone driving a golf cart MUST BE A licenced driver.**

On May 27, a resident driver reported watching a golf cart driven by a 9-year-old girl carrying two younger girls as passengers drive right through the stop sign at the intersections of Colonial Drive, Muirfield Drive, and Magnolia Point Boulevard. Expecting the cart to stop at the stop sign, the resident driver began a left turn onto Colonial, but had to break because the golf cart didn't stop.

There are three problems with this situation. First, this was a near-accident. Second, only licensed drivers may drive vehicles of any description on our roads. Third, ALL vehicles are required to stop at our stop signs. The Community Association just renewed its long-standing agreement with the Green Cove Springs Police to enforce Florida traffic laws in our community. They are patrolling several times each day and are issuing tickets. Many residents have paid hefty fines for running stop signs in their cars and in their golf carts.

Please consider the liability issue when you allow underage drivers to use your cart on our roads.

Heads up! Respect Florida traffic laws.

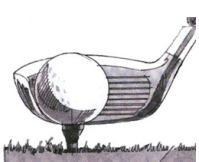

From Joe's Desk

GOLF COURSE:

At the time of this writing, we just had a great weekend of rain, badly needed. We have been watering more than usual and sometimes day and night. The luxury of 27 holes allowed us to close a nine, do some maintenance.....and water the nine. That should explain why the course is very green without the rains that keep passing us by.

The greens have basically recovered from transition, "but took longer without rainfall". The Bermuda grass on the greens is considerably stronger this season for a variety of reasons:

We sprayed the greens with a chemical the week of the May MGA event, it was designed to stunt and kill the Poa Trivialis (Winter grass), then we aerified and sanded and that helped the Bermuda growth without having to fight for water, and fertilizers.

Next year, at approximately this time, we will be going through the transition period again, it happens every year!

Twice in the first six months we brought in a contractor that injected air into all the greens. This had an immediate effect on drainage and root growth. The greens like humans need food, water, and oxygen to survive. This process puts a tremendous amount of pressure underground when injecting the air and it fractures the compacted areas to allow more air and water to enter below the surface.

DRAINS: We have targeted several greens for a drain system to stop the compaction on problem areas that we inherited. #1 Blue was the first addition, then #9 Red, and we are scheduling #2 Blue and #3 Blue as the next projects. The drains solve two issues, it eliminates the surface run off and, it has openings in the sides of the drain "underground" for ground water to escape through a porous material.

More drains on the left side of #3 Blue (greenside) have dried up that rough area and has helped that portion of the green. The lower right side in the middle is the next target.

WEEDS the other focus has been on the weed population all over the course, starting with the greens. There are a variety of weeds and we have spot sprayed the greens with a variety of chemicals. Killing them completely is not easy and we have sprayed certain weed circles three or four times. That way the Bermuda can fill

in the circled areas. We have also started to re-sod certain circles to expedite the process, and we will continue to do both as we are getting into prime time for Bermuda growth. Weeds in the fairways and roughs have been sprayed multiple times, sometimes by a large sprayer and some by hand spraying.

Thank you for the positive comments about the results of the weed eradication.

Fairway Drains.....we also replaced several drains on RED # 4 as you approach the green. That area is always wet (in the rainy season) and we concluded that the ground water had no where to go because the drains were surface drains only. Larger drains that allow the ground water to seep in have dramatically helped that situation.

At the beginning of the year, I announced that our main golf course focus was on greens and weed control, and **I am very pleased with the progress that Dana and his crew have produced.** It is easy to compare our course with any other, the variables of age, type of green construction, on going maintenance programs, budget allotments, rain (too much or too little) and manpower, change from course to course.

TENNIS: Barrett Johnson has had a very successful series of clinics, summer camps for the children, and has acquired several USTA sanctioned tennis tournaments for the entire year. He does individual and group lessons. All the clay has been replaced on the courts. Remember that the guest program is the honor system, call the office, extension two, and leave them the number of tennis guests with you.

POOL: The pool is getting more popular with the heat and the 28th hole is a great escape for the members. The Swim team ends their season on the 13th of this month. Remember to call the club with the number of pool guests that you may bring with you on a daily basis. Call the club for carry out lunch at the pool.....269-9276 ext #3.

From Tee to Green

Since early February, we have been using a different approach in regards to the fertility and soil amendment needs of the greens. Without getting too technical, I will try to explain what has occurred in the last 4 to 5 months.

Basically, we are amending the soil with elements such as calcium, potassium and other minor elements that were depleted or not readily available to the plant. Soil and tissue tests were taken and they showed that there was quite an imbalance of certain elements such as sulfur and salts. In fact, the sulfur was so high we couldn’t believe there was any grass even growing! The calcium was almost non-existing and the ph (per cent hydrogen) was very low. So, it has taken these last few months to begin to detoxify the soil, put back what was depleted and flush out what was harmful.

One other key factor in rejuvenating the soil was “air injection”. Probes were injected into the soil to a depth of 12 inches. Air was then forced into the ground at a controllable rate, loosening the soil and creating fissures and cracks. We have done this procedure twice already this year and plan on doing two more. I can’t put into

words how this procedure has really helped in bringing the greens back.

At this writing, most all of the greens are completely covered with bermuda and forming into a tight knit turf. They are still putting a little slow, but we will lower the height within the next two weeks. We will continue to verticut and lightly topdress throughout the summer.

The next step is to get rid of the nutgrass on the greens. It’s that dark shiny-leaved patches of grass that is fairly prevalent on some greens such as #2 White, #4 Red, and #4 Blue. We will be spraying a herbicide (Monument) starting on July 10th. We will be using a quarter of the recommended rate every 10 days to gradually eradicate the nutsedge so as not to hinder the bermuda grass. This gradual procedure will help in letting the bermuda grass fill in and take over the sedges.

I must say that I’m excited that the fertility and soil amendment program we started early this year has greatly improved and rejuvenated the greens. They are headed in the right direction and we will continue to keep them healthy.

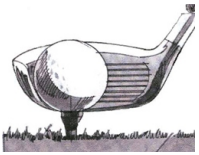

MEMBER SUPPORT

Thank you to those that have taken the time to comment on the positive condition of the golf course and clubhouse grounds.

Dana had a plan, it was approved, it is working as expected, and I think he is doing a great job. We are not finished!

MORE MEMBER SUPPORT

I need the members to spread the word about Magnolia Point. If we want to eventually go back to a Private Course then tell someone something positive. Whether it is a neighbor, or resident who is not a member, or a member for a day, (outside play) word of mouth is more powerful than any advertising medium.

We currently have the same number of golf and tennis members as when I arrived over two years ago. Many have moved in, many have moved on. As I have said many times, the number of members that currently exist **cannot** cover the expense of operating 27 holes and 7 tennis courts. **Outside play will continue and escalate or diminish** based on the amount of members that exist. That should be no secret by now, and supporting the club is something that also will help.

What is supporting the Club I pay my dues?

The dues that one pays is allocated to the maintenance and service for the type of membership one utilizes. In my upcoming annual letter to the members, I will actually break out some of the **expenses** for this operation. You will find it rather staggering, and that does not reflect the volatility of gasoline and electric bills. The cost per round break out that was previously mailed clearly explained the value of your golfing expenses.

Supporting the club is: coming for dinner **without it being a special golf, social, or seasonal event.** If the words "food minimum" is a concern, then one may never come to the club to just enjoy an evening. If one never eats out, **we understand**, you can still be positive about the club.

Utilizing the Pro Shop buyers "plan", whether you are a golfer or not. (You save \$\$\$.)

Bringing a neighbor to dinner, everyone inside the gate should at least be a Clubhouse Member, the food is **most reasonably** priced and good. Give them an application at dinner. Members currently get a 10% discount on regular food and drinks.

Bring a new neighbor to play golf or tennis!

Myth . . . There are more buffet dinners than plated – check the calendar.

We have started multiple activities to attract members, new and old. Check the newsletter and calendar.

New members come from experiencing good course conditions, total service, good food, and meeting happy/satisfied people.

If you haven't checked around the county, **27 holes is quite the advantage.** All of the neighboring clubs are having outings and offering outside play, and their members cannot play at all if the course is booked. Here, we can start you on 9 holes earlier and turn to the third nine if an event or outing is taking place, or worse case, you can play the same nine twice, utilizing different sets of tees each nine. **Either way you can still play golf at your course with 27 holes.**

Magnolia Point is not perfect, but it is a community unlike any other in the county, and a great value for the money. Tell someone about it!

GREENS UPDATE:

We have already started lightly spraying the RED Nine greens for eventual disintegration of the "Nut or Sedge Grass," whichever you prefer to call it.

A light spraying of the entire green will not affect the Bermuda and will start to discolor the weed. The discoloration has started on the RED Nine.

We will be spraying the other nines in the next 6 days. One spraying will not do it, two possibly three will occur. The Bermuda will eventually take over the weed areas as they are weakened from the chemicals. Total eradication will take multiple weeks, probably up to the point of when we do the final green aerification with smaller tines.

DRAINS:

The next two greens that will be affected are Blue #2 (Top back Left area), and the right side of Blue #3.

CART PATH ENTRANCES/EXITS:

Lastly, this summer we will start to repair the BUMPY areas with a new underground rubber product for drainage and new sod, so as to eliminate the jarring of the carts and teeth.

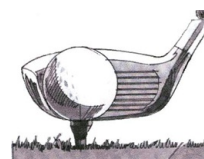

From Tee to Green

Over the past month, we have been spraying the greens with a herbicide to eradicate the nutsedge. As you can see, there are some greens that had quite a bit of it on them. The good news is that the bermudagrass will take over the void left from killing the sedges. I estimate it will take 3 to 4 weeks to fill in the voids.

We aerified the greens on August 21/22 which was the final one for this year. It has been over a week and we are still picking up quite a bit of sand. This, in turn, dulls the greens mower reels and results in a poor quality cut.

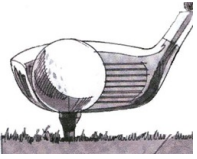

From Tee to Green

It's overseeding time again! On Monday, October 23rd, the white and blue nines will be closed for overseeding the greens (weather permitting). The red nine will remain open. On Wednesday, October 25, the red nine will be closed for overseeding.

Preparation for overseeding the greens will be fairly simple. First, we verticut the greens in two directions and clean up the debris. Then, we apply the seed in two directions, lightly topdress and finally, drag the greens with a drag brush. The greens height of cut will remain the same as it is now. We will also be applying a granular starter fertilizer and lightly syringing the greens until germination occurs, typically 7 to 10 days.

Preparation for overseeding the tees and collars is pretty much the same as the greens except we will not topdress. We will start verticutting and seeding the tees the week prior to the greens (Oct. 16-20th). The driving range and clubhouse will also be overseeded.

For those new to this area, this is an annual event that changes the grasses for the Winter/Spring seasons. The Bermuda grass will eventually go dormant with cool weather and the Winter grasses will be green and lush as they love the cool temperatures.

Men's Senior Interclub

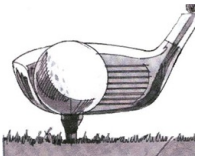
