SATURDAY the 20th . . . the **MGA** has their opening golf tournament, sign up sheet is in the Pro Shop.

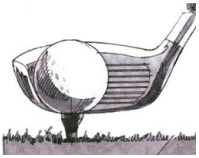
We continue to try new and different activities/menus throughout the year. **CARRY OUT** is more and more popular and we are a person to handle carry out calls only.

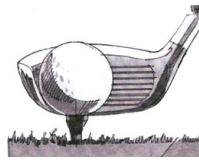

From Tee to Green

There are a couple of issues that need to be addressed concerning golf cart rules and trespassing.

First, if you are not playing golf, you should not be on the golf course. This includes walking, jogging or bicycling down the fairways or cart paths. Also, no pets are allowed on the course for obvious reasons. Signs are posted throughout the golf course stating “No Trespassing,” so please, observe them since this could result in a liability if someone is injured.

Next, I would like to again go over the cart rules when the course is wet. When the carts are restricted to “cart paths only”, this means on holes with a continuous cart path from tee to green, CARS MUST STAY ON THE PATH AT ALL TIMES!!! Those holes include Red 1-3, 5 and 8; Blue 4, 5, 8 and 9; and White 2, 6 and 7. That leaves 15 other holes with partial cart paths.

Not to avoid confusion by going over each hole and where you should go (and taking into consideration non-member players), we have come up with a simple solution. During wet times, we will put out fluorescent survey flags to mark which side of the hole the carts can go AND only will be allowed to go. We hope to eliminate carts going down both sides of the fairway which contradicts “cart path only”. Unfortunately, this means more walking to your ball and a little longer to play. There are too many players bending the cart path and rough rule and virtually going where ever they wish. This will also help protect against unwanted ruts on the course and keep the course in better shape during inclement weather.

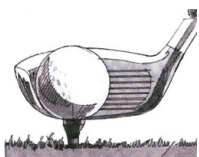

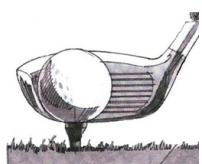

From Tee to Green

We are currently in a battle against the explosion of winter weeds, primarily poa annua (annual bluegrass) on the golf course.

We are spraying herbicides and in doing so it has in some areas stunted the bermudagrass temporarily. It should green back up in a couple of weeks. I plan on having the course sprayed out by April 6th.

This infestation is a result of having such a mild winter and the fact that poa annua seed can lay in a dormant state for many years until climatic conditions are favorable for germination. This is one of those years! We are not the Lone Ranger in dealing with this outbreak. I have talked to several of my fellow superintendents and they are also having a problem with poa annua.

The good news is that when temperatures start getting into the high 80's, poa annua starts to die out quite rapidly. It can't stand the heat!

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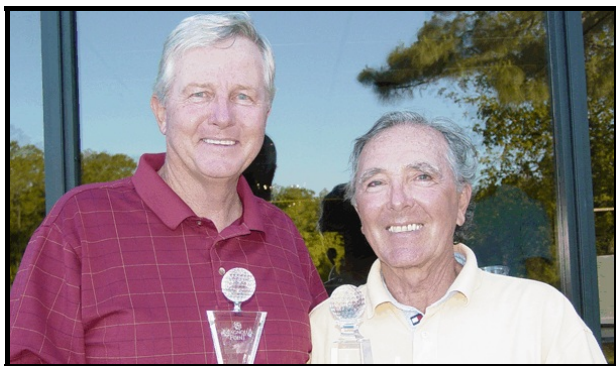

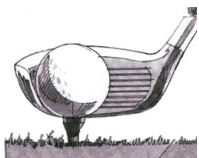

From Tee to Green



As you know, we are in the process of slicing all the fairways to relieve compaction and aid in drainage. We have completed the Red fairways and nos. 3, 4, 7, and 8 on the White Nine, nos. 7 and 9 on the Blue. After the member-guest, we will continue slicing the remainder of the fairways.

Now, here is the problem -- over the years, some of the sprinklers in the fairways have had wires moled from the sprinkler back to the field controllers. The slicer is currently cutting to an eight inch depth and the moled wires are at a three inch depth. Our plan of attack is to go ahead and slice the remainder of the fairways, turn on the sprinklers, whichever ones don't come up, we trench new wires to a depth of 12 inches back to the controller and be done with it. I have no idea (and neither does my assistant, Corey Jamros) how many wires are going to be cut. Some fairways maybe one or none, others maybe 10

or more. What I'm getting at is there will be small trenches in the fairways that will take up to a month to grow over, so play it as ground under repair and wish me luck! Thank you,

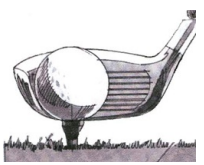
Men's Senior Interclub Golf

There never should be a time when a player misses a putt or hits a faulty shot on purpose. **All players are required to post every round into the handicap system.** If you play 13 holes and you are rained out, you must post an 18 hole score (holes 14-18 post your score based on your course handicap). If you are rained out during holes 7-12, you must post a nine hole score. If you play nine holes, you must post a nine hole

From Tee to Green



It's that time of year again when it starts getting hot and the greens start to transition from the poa trivialis overseed back to bermudagrass. On June 6, we will spray the greens with a herbicide to slowly eradicate the poa trivialis.

It takes about 7 to 10 days to take effect and has no effect on the bermudagrass. This aids in transition in that there is less competition for nutrients and water for the bermuda to fill in quicker.

Then, on June 13th and 14th (weather permitting), we will be aerifying the greens with 1 inch in diameter hollow tines on a four inch center and top dressing with sand. I will also be raising the height of cut until the bermuda fills in. So be prepared for slow bumpy greens for about three weeks after we aerify. Thank you,

Sunday Breakfast/Brunch: We have temporarily discontinued Sunday breakfast and brunch for the summer months. They will be back again in the fall scheduling.

From Tee To Green



As of this writing, it has been two weeks since we aerified the greens. Some of them are progressing better than others, but what I have noticed is that they all are covered with different amounts of Bermuda grass (except for the collar around the putting green which we probably are going to have to sod). Keep in mind that where the Bermuda is thin on the greens is where the overseed has checked out, and it will take time for it to fill in and form a turf.

How long? Some of them another week or so, some two or three. I see progression everyday, we are using some quick release fertilizers and other nutrients weekly to grow the greens into a turf as fast as possible.

We are not alone in this area, other courses are in similar or even worse condition, especially if they have 20 year old push up greens. This time of year (transition) is the worse time for superintendents -- all the golfers hate us.

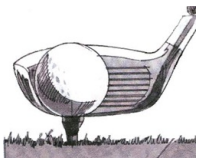

From Tee to Green



For the most part, the greens are finally coming around. There are a couple of them, such as Blue #5 and #9 and Red #6, 7, and 8, that are still behind in growth and overall coverage. On Blue #9 we will sod the bad areas and Blue #5 should grow in. Plus, Red #6, 7, and 8 will be sodded in the collar areas. Also, we will plug the areas on the greens where we killed the bullweed.

Normally, August is when we do the second aerification on the greens with the smaller tines. Instead, we are going to run the fairway slicer over them to try to aid in drainage and therefore, stimulate more root growth. After we slice them, we will roll them out and apply a light top-dressing. There will be minimal disturbance to the putting surface. Once this heals over (about a week), we will apply a plant growth regulator and lower the height of cut. Weather permitting, we will be slicing starting on August 13th.

Posting Scores

Fair handicapping depends upon full, accurate information regarding a player's potential scoring ability as reflected by a complete and accurate scoring record. Every golfer shall be responsible for recording all acceptable scores, as defined below. This includes adjustments of Equitable Stroke Control.

Scores must be made in accordance with the principles of the Rules of Golf.

The following are acceptable methods to score:

1. If 13 or more holes are played, the player shall post an 18 hole score. If you are not able to finish a hole, or chose not to finish, you will post a par, plus the number of strokes you would receive on that hole. An example is on a Par 4 and your handicap would have given you 2 strokes, your score would be 4 + 2 = 6.
2. If you play less than 13 holes, but more than 7 holes, you would post a nine hole score by the same method.

Equitable Stroke Control:

<u>Your Course Handicap</u>	<u>Max. strokes per hole</u>
9 or less	double bogey
10 through 19	7
20 through 29	8
30 through 39	9
40 or more	10

I have noticed several times, golfers not finishing a hole. Please take note -- if you pick up your ball and do not finish a hole, you must score what you would most likely would have made. Keep in mind the "Equitable Stroke Control."

One last reminder -- you may only have one Handicap Index. Neither the USGA or Magnolia Point Golf will accept groups keeping separate handicaps.

From Tee to Green



I must admit that I am glad it's finally September. Even though July and August were the hottest months on record with a below average rainfall, the courses held up fairly well. Remember, bermudagrass is a warm weather grass, not a "hot season" one.

Greens Update: We sodded the weak areas on #1 and #9 blue and sliced both along with #5 blue. The sod jobs turned out nicely and are rooted in well. We normally aerify in August with 1/2 inch hollow tines and topdress afterward, but have decided to forego it this year. Instead, we will use a cross tine in the weak algae areas to help break up the black algae and promote better coverage. Also, we will lightly verticut every week to help reduce grain and speed up the greens a touch.

Other maintenance this month will include tree removal, sand trap and cart path edging, weeding and pine strawing flower beds. I apologize that these tasks haven't been done sooner, but with abnormal turn over in staff and training new maintenance employees plus other issues, it was tough just to do our normal routine tasks. Like I mentioned before, I am very happy that this summer is winding down!

Finally, I would like to wish Travis Wilson good luck in his new career. The golf professional and the course superintendent's communication is one of the most critical components in a successful golf course operation. I've worked with several golf pros in my career, and I must say Travis was the easiest and most receptive pro I have ever worked with. Thank you, Travis, for making my job that much more enjoyable! You will be missed.

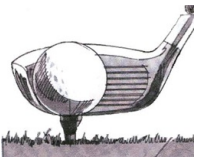
Senior Interclub Golf

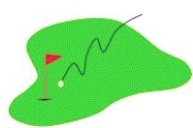

From Tee to Green



October is "overseeding month." Starting the week of October 15, we will prepare the tees, collars and greens for seeding. The tees and collars will be seeded the week of October 22nd and the greens, the week of October 29th.

Basically, overseeding is a fairly simple process. Sowing seed is the easiest part -- prepping the turf takes a little longer. We start out by aggressively verticutting the tees and collars in two directions so that the ryegrass will have good seed-to-soil contact. Next, we put a pre-emerge herbicide down around the perimeter of the tees and collars to prevent ryegrass germination in the rough around the tees and collars. Then, we use drop spreaders to sow the seed.

Greens overseeding prep is similar to tees and collars. We will verticut in two directions, sow the seed in two

directions, lightly topdress, and lightly brush the seed into the green. Greens height of cut will remain the same as will the tee and collar heights.

We should be able to complete all overseeding with a minimal (if any) disruption of play.

Now that the cooler temperatures have arrived and we are not constantly mowing, we are shifting our focus to other maintenance activities. Some of these include tree removal and stump grinding, drainage work in the bunkers, adding sand to bunkers that need it, renting a chipper and mulching the piles of dead tree limbs and debris behind the driving range, and sprucing up and pine strawing the flower beds throughout the course.

It has now been a little more than a month since we overseeded the tees, greens, and collars and, for the most part, we are pleased with the results. There are a few greens that were a little slow in germination, some others that were a little thin in some areas, so we went back in and added more seed. It will take a couple of more weeks for the greens to mature in to a full turf. This year, we switched to a different three-way blend of poa trivialis and we are very pleased with the color and vigor of this new blend. The tees and collars also turned out nicely.

Just this last week, we decided to add three target greens for 40 to 60 yard shots in front of the north driving range tee. We overseeded the three "greens" and added flagpoles. We also overseeded the other three target greens on the range.

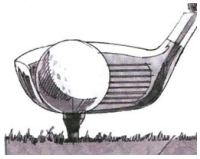
