Clay County Golf Classic Returns

The 16th annual Reinhold Clay County Golf Classic set for April 4-6, 2008 will open the event for the first time to players outside of Clay County. The tournament, established to award youth scholarships and promote junior golf, has awarded 192 scholarships for nearly \$270,000 to Clay County students since its inception. This year's tournament committee hopes opening the "Classic" to new players will fill the field for an exciting event and increase scholarship donations.

The format is for individual play, broken into flights of 8 players based on handicap indexes. The maximum field is 112 players with 48 from the Men's Division, 40 from the Senior Division, and 24 from the Ladies Division.

Participation is open to all golfers at least 18 years of age as of April 4, 2008 who have an established USGA handicap. Senior entrants must be 55 years of age by April 4, 2008. Participants from 2007 will be extended an advance entry opportunity thru February 1, 2008. Entry forms and additional information are available at www.ClayCountyGolfClassic.com.

The "Classic" will open Friday, April 4 at Eagle Harbor Golf Club. Round two and the Saturday evening reception will be held at Magnolia Point Golf and Country Club on April 5th. The final round will be at Eagle Landing on Sunday, April 6th.

January has been chilly, but all one has to do is watch the Weather Channel in the morning to be reminded how good this weather really is!

Course Maintenance: The annual clean up of the golf course properties has started and this year, we are removing trees as opposed to just trimming some limbs and debris. A number of experts in the golf industry brought to our attention the fact that our greens and tees are suffering from a lack of sunlight and air circulation. We have started a program to correct this situation and will be doing more in February and March. The first task is to drop the trees, so we can get instant sunlight and then, the trimming and cleaning up follows. Approximately 99% of the trees will not be touched and the benefits will be obvious when completed.

Amenity Proposal: The proposal has been negotiated with the MPCA Board of Directors and basically, every point has been improved or changed for the benefit of all residents. It is at the legal stage now getting words added that will protect all entities. More details will follow when this step is completed.

Valentine's Gourmet Dinner: The gourmet dinner theme has really caught on and the feedback from the Gourmet New Year's Eve party has rolled over into Valentine's Day. At the time of this writing, there are a few tables left, so call Dyal now to get on the list.

The "BLUE PLATE SPECIALS" on Wednesday and Thursday evenings in the 28th Hole are gaining momentum, and will continue in February and March. answering questions that came up concerning all aspects of the golf course including, tree removal, drainage, irrigation, tees and bunker issues, yardage markers, and improving the 21 year old push-up greens. I believe everyone left the meeting having a better understanding in what is involved in maintaining the golf course than they had in the past, and knowing that their involvement is very important to the management. So, if you have a question about the golf course, ask one of the Greens Committee members and they will bring it up at our next meeting.

We will be aerifying the greens with small solid tines the first week of February. The holes will be a little bigger than a pencil in diameter and on two inch centers. There will be very little disturbance to the greens surfaces. It's being done to help relieve compaction and add air into the root zone area.

We are winding down our tree removal project for this winter. We have just a few more trees to cut in the first week of March. We are contracting a stump grinding service to come in and grind all the stumps down. For the most part, I have heard positive feedback from the members about the

project and personally, I am very pleased with how the greens have responded to more sunlight and air movement especially #1, #5, #8, and #9 on the Blue Nine. Almost all of the black algae that was prevalent on those greens is gone or drying up.

Also in early March, we will chip all the tree debris from behind the driving range, #1 blue and #8 blue. Free mulch will again be available behind the driving range, so please take all you want

This month, we will fertilize the entire golf course "wall to wall" with a pre-emergent herbicide on a fertilizer carrier. Then, the whole golf course should be greening up nicely by mid to late March, depending on the weather.

Another good suggestion from a Green's Committee member is to have a "Message" sign board outside the Pro Shop front door. With three #1 Tee Boxes, this is the most logical spot as everyone checks in or picks up a range token at that location. **Thank you Bart Wood!**

Golf Course - MAKEOVER TIME!

"We are not at all satisfied with course conditions." Factors contributing to these conditions were discussed in detail with the Golf Course Superintendent who explained his disappointments and the set backs his staff have incurred over a period of time.

Weather has been the main factor in the recovery of the fairways. Although it has been a pleasant winter season for play, the golf course does not begin to bounce back until we have 55 to 60 degree temperatures at night. We had one stretch of growing weather a month ago and then, it cooled down again. Right now, we are in the second warm night stretch.

It is time for a makeover and beginning May 5, the Blue

Course will be closed to all play and remain closed through most of July. The proposed work will improve fairways and drainage (a major factor) on the Blue Course. This nine has always been the first to close because of poor drainage. Closing nine holes for a day at a time every week does not get enough accomplished.

Old fairway drains will be replaced and new ones added. The Blue fairways will also be SLICED for better drainage and growth. However, when we did this on other fairways, we found out the irrigation wiring was not installed deep enough. Where necessary, we will rewire.

The fairway of #7 Blue has always been the thinnest and weakest. We will verticut the fairway, de thatch and seed it with Bermuda seed comparable to the existing blend. In good growing conditions, it takes three to four weeks for the new seed to mature. Other weak spots will be treated the same way. Greens that have some weak spots will be sodded.

The tree removal program to add sunlight and air circulation was successful and will continue in similar areas.

Closings of White and Red courses will be done in a systematic order with similar improvements planned. Cosmetic improvements on all 27 holes are expected to improve playing conditions.

The "Drill & Fill" process (tested on the putting green) will be done to all 27 greens beginning in mid-June. Currently, the maintenance staff is spraying for weeds and fixing the scalped plugs of the old cups on all greens.

Members are asked to encourage players to remove flag sticks with more caution so as not to damage the holes and to be aware of how close one steps near the cup.

Discussion was held on replacing one or two sand bunkers with a grass bunker, but no final decision has been made on that issue.

Having only 18 holes will create some adjustments on everyone's part. Tee times will be closely monitored to effectively fill the course. Preferred tee times will still be in effect, as long as they are all being used.

The Blue course needs the most attention and the summer is the best time for recovery from this type of work. This is designed to be a good, long term solution to a variety of situations.

As you know, we will close the Blue Nine on Monday, May 5th. No time line is set for re-opening the Blue course because we will do several projects (mainly drainage issues) that may take longer than anticipated and while trenching drain lines, we have no idea what we may encounter.

Over the last 20+ years, there have been many irrigation wires connected to sprinkler heads from the satellite controllers. The majority of these wires were only 3 to 4 inches underground. So, when we start to trench for drain lines and slice the fairways, we will cut wires to the sprinkler heads. After the drain lines and slicing is completed, we will have to re-trench to a depth of 12 inches for the wires that were cut.

Our main goal in closing the Blue course is to improve drainage and compaction problems due to the age of the course and the predominantly heavy clay type soil that naturally drains slow. We will also do some tee work such as leveling the green tee on #8 Blue and adding more teeing area on the white tee on the same hole.

Other improvements to the Blue Nine will include verticutting the fairways, which has not been done before, and seeding areas that are thin or bare with a turf type bermudagrass. Also, we will drill and fill the greens in June starting with the Blue Nine and then, the White/Red.

So as you can see, we will be very busy this summer on the Blue Nine and feel confident that this is a project will greatly improve the playability of it and it is well overdue.

The Amenity Proposal was a well-defined plan for the long term success and future of this community. There will not be another proposal as some have suggested. Members approved will also receive a letter stating that a NUMBERED TRANSFERABLE CERTIFICATE OF MEMBERSHIP will be available for the resale of your home. Regardless of the type of Membership you maintain, your future buyer will be relieved of the then current Initiation Fee to the Club.

GOLF COURSE: The golf course is undergoing a make over. The Blue nine has been closed and will reopen when all work is completed. After that, one of the other Nines will be closed for improvements and then, the last Nine. This is the summer of correcting old deficiencies and adding features.

The tree removal, which is for the sole purpose of saving and improving Greens and Tee conditions, has been successful. The maturity of the trees has affected the amount of sunlight and air circulation throughout the course, and the lack of same created a losing situation. This ongoing process is expensive when it comes to cutting, stump grinding and removing of the trees off the property, but a worthwhile solution. Some new

maintenance equipment is also under consideration. The Greens Committee has been quite helpful in passing on suggestions and relaying information to the members. Thank you, Greens Committee. Please remember, we will only have 18 HOLES until we are completed.

It's that time of year again -- summer transition on the greens. Due to the heat, the overseeded poa trivialis dies out and the tifdwarf bermudagrass starts to grow. The orangish color you see on the greens is the poa trivialis dying because it cannot tolerate temperatures above 85 degrees. Tifdwarf is

traditionally a slow growing type of bermuda, so we have been on a foliar and granular fertilizer program on a weekly basis to accelerate growth as fast as possible on the greens. But, it still will take a good month or so for the tifdwarf to fill in. It's just the nature of the beast, so to speak.

We will "drill and fill" the greens in the month of June. Several members saw the demo on the putting green back in February. It's a process where 1 inch holes are drilled into the greens to a depth of 12 inches on 6 inch centers and then, we fill in with a mixture of sand and a soil amendment to promote growth, add air, and improve water movement through the soil.

The blue nine "face lift" is coming along as scheduled. All the fairways have been sliced a nd now the drainage work and re-trenching of cut irrigation lines will begin the first week of June. The Blue #7 fairway has been seeded, germinated and is filling in as expected. The two bunkers on Blue #6 will be filled in and sodded over. Bunkers with drainage issues are being addressed and new drain pipe will be installed. The green tee on #8 Blue will be leveled and re-sodded.

Greens Committee Report - May 29....

Members present included: Bob Isgan, Debbie Brown, Carolyn Hickman, Bart Wood, Tony Seago, Tom Branch. Staffincluded: Josh Anderson, Dana Anderson, Joe III and Joe Jr.

The committee met at the first hole on the Blue Course and proceeded to view, first hand, the progress being made on all nine holes.

Dana explained in detail the work that has already been accomplished including:

- Additional tree removal
- Pruning branches along many of the fairways
- ► Slicing all nine Fairways for better grass growth
- Drainage has been laid out
- ► Additional drains and trap drains along many of the fairways are being installed
- ► Repair drain in the fairway bunker on #2

Replacing old irrigation wire on some of the fairways is underway. Many of the old underground wires and valves controlling the watering system throughout the nine holes are being replaced as they were not installed deep enough and were cut when the fairways were sliced (as expected.)

Work on the Greens has been completed or is underway which includes patching weak sod areas and sanding, spiking and the "Drill and Fill" process to improve ventilation and drainage. Dana explained that the brown spots on some of the greens are the grass in transition.

Hole #5, the par 3, will have the greenside bunker on the right downsized and reshaped. Additional tree removal and cleaning out of the area behind green will be completed before the course is reopened.

Hole #6, in addition to the fairway work, will have the two greenside bunkers filled in completely.

Hole #7, which has been of high concern to members, has been double sliced, seeded, verticutted and thatched. Limbs from trees on left of fairway have been trimmed for additional sunlight and one tree removed. The Committee was pleased with the results of the work that has been done on this hole.

The tee box for the Green Tees on Hole #8 will be reconstructed and leveled along with additional tree and brush removal near the green.

Additional work to be completed includes repairing the concrete area leaving the bridge on Hole #2.

Overall, the committee was pleased to see the improvements of playing conditions throughout the nine holes on the Blue course.

The course will remain closed until all work is completed. Then, the White or Red course will have a "make over."

The committee noticed there were signs of practice play on the course and advises members to **Please Do Not Practice** on the courses that are closed for renovation.

The next meeting is Thursday, June 26 at 4:08.

From Tee to Green



Tropical Storm Fay sure threw a monkey wrench into our plans for course improvements and set us back about two weeks in getting the three nines cut back down to normal levels. Twelve plus inches of rain in four days will do that.

Originally, we planned to close each nine for three to four weeks to concentrate on improving problem areas such as drainage, slicing fairways, and drill/fill the greens.

The Red and Blue Nine have been done and we were going to close the White until Fay came along.

Weather permitting, here is the revised schedule of events:

- 1. Close the Blue Nine on Sept. 2nd to drill and fill the worst draining greens again #1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 9.
- 2. Re-open the Blue on Sept. 5th or 6th.
- 3. Close the White on September 8th to solid tine aerify the greens, finish shaping and sodding the tee addition on #2, fix the drainage issue on #2 greenside bunker, dig the ditch adjacent to #9 fairway out so we won't have to continually pull carts out of it. Fix the drainage issue in the fairway on #9 as well
- 4. Re-open the White on Sept. 12th in time for the Magnolia Cup.

We decided to wait until next year to drill/fill the greens on the White Nine since all of those greens (except #9) drain very well. Solid tine aerifying will suffice for now.

Starting on September 15th, we will go back to closing one "Nine" on Mondays and Wednesdays.

Thank you for your cooperation with "Cart Path Only" when we are wet conditions.






