- One \$16 check is still outstanding in the checking account. This is the refund check for a resident who purchased luminaria kits online (each spouse did not realize the other purchased).
- The club's annual insurance was paid in February. The amount is \$645.39.
- February 2026 was the first month the club received money for the advertisements in The Magnolia News. The treasurer sent e-mails to five advertisers and four advertisers have paid online, using the Zeffy account. The total amount received is \$300.00.
- The 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary event committee has \$1,649.00 plus the \$1,000.00 the board agreed to put toward the event, totaling \$2,649.00. \$200 has been paid to Club Continental to secure the venue on September 9, 2026.
- The club has 168 paid members.
