Thank you to all 2025-26 board members! Your support and hard work for the Club this past year has been amazing and it was an honor to serve as your President.

- A check for \$1,080.00 was written (still outstanding) for the cost of the salad bar for the installation luncheon to be held on May 13, 2026.
- A \$100 check written on the schools' account is still outstanding (reimbursement for gift cards purchased for Bannerman students).
- The treasurer filed the club's not for profit corporation annual report with the State of Florida on April 21st.
- The yard and plant sale on April 25, 2026 made \$2,437.
- Since the new fiscal year started on May 1st, several people have paid their annual dues of \$35 online with Zeffy. Dues are payable through the month of May.
