- Linda Werring (Treasurer): The Club just ended the fiscal year. Last year the club brought in \$41,000 and \$27,600 of that was fundraising. The Club gave out more than \$26,500 (\$20,000 in scholarships) and the rest went to 13 local charities. Total expenses for the year were \$40,500. Dues were due in May, now are \$40 if you have not paid.
- Jennifer St. Mary (Activities Director): The first outing for this year is next Tuesday. Eighteen ladies have signed up for lunch at Red's Wine Bar at 11:30. Then the group will go to see the Freedom 250

Anniversary Mobile Museum. Jennifer requested suggestions for outings or speakers, and she needs some members to step forward to help on this committee.

- Nancy Catudal (Fundraising Director): Nancy announced there will be another Designer Bag Bingo event to be held on a Monday in October at the Green Cove Springs Elks Club. She is looking for a member to chair for this fundraiser. The bingo procedure is in writing but Nancy will be with the chair throughout the fundraiser. The event could also have co-chairs. She recognized and thanked Nancy Mills for her work on the luminaria fundraiser for scholarships.
